Adventure Yourselves in Christ

We have progressed into the New Year already for about a month. Back in South Korea, we used to celebrate the Lunar New Year saying "Many blessings to you" while bowing down on the floor especially to parents and grandparents. Many still celebrate it. I liked the practice. This year the Lunar New Year begins February 10. So according to the lunar calendar, it's not the New Year yet. Often, I take advantage of this inbetween time after so much busy Christmas season, in order to fully reflect on how I can make the New Year new and how I can furnish the months ahead. Many have said they are of two minds about New Year's resolutions. They like the idea of declaring an intention to make a change, while deploring the idea of setting themselves up to fail.

For years, my own New Year's resolutions have taken a form of prayer supplications on three levels—ministry, family and personal ones, as I take time to write them on my prayer journal to check how God answered my prayers at the end of the year. This year, I did the same. Also I delved into the Wesleyan Covenant for Renewal as I read the little book, **One Faithful Promise** by Magrey R. deVega. **Revelation 3:16** says, **"So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth**." Being lukewarm for Christ was not an option for Wesley.

In August 1755, in front of 1,800 people in a village church in England, John Wesley introduced a service that he expected to inoculate people from anything like a moralistic therapeutic deism in his day. He reminded them that God is not a giant dispenser of cheap grace, nor did God belong to them. Instead, they belonged to God. And they must let God control their lives, rather than try to control God for their needs. Wesley recorded in his journal: "*At six in the evening we met for that purpose. After I had recited the movement of the proposed covenant, all those who desired to give testimony of their entrance into this covenant stood up, to the number of about 1,800 persons. Such a night I'd rarely seen before. Surely the fruit of it will remain forever." (from One Faithful Promise by Magrey R. deVega)*

Finally, in 1780, Wesley codified the observance of the covenant renewal service with a set of instructions titled, "Directions for Renewing Our Covenant with God." They included **5** essential steps:

- 1. Confide in God.
- 2. Compose your spirit.
- 3. Claim the covenant.
- 4. Choose faithfulness.
- 5. Connect to God in prayer.

Wesley stresses three foundational principles that integrate these instructions for maintaining a covenant in daily life together. First, things eternal are much more considerable than things temporal. Second, things not seen are as certain as the things that are seen. Finally, upon your present choice depends upon your eternal future. These are so powerful, aren't they?

Also, we Methodists can make the New Year new, based on two brief guides to Christian formation to live out our identity and responsibilities to God. And we should seal that commitment in covenant renewal. I want to assure us of an ethic of conduct for daily living according to the Bishop Reuben Job's *"Three Simple Rules: A Wesleyan Way of Living"*, published in 2007—**Do no harm; Do all the good that you can; Stay in love with God**. Then in 2015, Steve Harper wrote *"Five Marks of a Methodist: The Fruit of a Living Faith"*, based on John Wesley's treatise The Character of a Methodist, which is about forming character:

A Methodist loves God;

A Methodist rejoices in God;

A Methodist gives thanks;

A Methodist prays constantly;

A Methodist loves others.

Wesley concludes his directions with the stirring charge: *Adventure yourselves in Christ.* He writes, "As a poor captive exile...meeting for a while with a pilot, who offers to transport him safely home, Jesus embarks on an adventure with him and everything he has in his vessel: you should do likewise. Christ offers, if you will venture forth with him, and then he will bring you home, and he will bring you to God."

Aldersgate, are you willing to embrace and welcome this adventure? We know God is not there to obey our whims, but rather God will demand nothing less than our full obedience and surrender, because God wants to bring you and me home. So, let's adventure ourselves in Christ, as we pray like Wesley did:

"Lord Jesus, will you act on my behalf? Will you bring me to God, bring me into the promised land?

With you will I venture forth;

I throw myself upon you, upon your blood, upon your righteousness; I lay up all my hopes and invest my whole interest, whole being, and body with you."

> Lead Team Meeting Minutes December 19, 2023



The Lead Team held a special meeting on December 19 to consider whether Al-

dersgate should proceed with the Catalyst initiative as recommended by Conference advisors at our November 12th Town Hall meeting.

Henry Daum reported that the Readiness Team had received positive feedback from the congregation and that the Readiness Team had voted unanimously to move forward with Catalyst. Henry reminded the Lead Team that:

- * It doesn't cost Aldersgate any money to participate in Catalyst.
- * We'll be leveraging people from the conference who have been through this before and partnering with other churches going through Catalyst.
- * We won't be signing a contract so we can stop at any time.

The Lead Team unanimously approved Aldersgate proceeding with the Catalyst initiative. The next steps are:

- * Pastor Kyung-Hee and the Core Team will submit a formal application for Catalyst by Feb. 15th.
- * Catalyst-related activities are scheduled to begin in May.


