THE POWER OF CONFESSION

I wonder how you feel need for your spiritual checkup like you do for your physical check-up. Recently, I found some spiritual symptoms like impatience and fatigue creeping into my life. I wondered what caused them. During my vacation, I finally took time to check in with my Spiritual Doctor God who has been patiently waiting for me to own up the sins of disobeying God's Sabbath commandment and mistrusting God's work in our midst beyond my own efforts. I felt the need of restoration and healing, but didn't know what to do about it, until I finally took time to confess my sins and prayed repeatedly, "Forgive me, Lord. Renew me. Restore me. Do not crush my soul."

Have you ever thought of this: "What does confession do to your soul?" In an interview with Dallas Willard, the author of *Divine Conspiracy*, John Ortberg asked Willard, "How did you find that you have a soul?" He replied, "I found that I had a soul through the realization that I was not a whole person at some point of my life." He explained that when we sin, we are splitting ourselves up. When we come to confess our sins, we realize we have a soul. When we confess sins, we are not splitting ourselves up since we return to God through confession.

How many of you have had this dimension of soul-full experience through confession or repentance? I once joined a pastors' retreat which featured a theme of "Prayer and Healing." We were invited to posture ourselves for any free style of prayers for an hour as the Spirit led. One hour's prayer time served well to meet the required intimacy with God. I heard some sobbing during prayers. Though I couldn't hear actual words of prayer, I felt most pastors were lifting up confessional and lamenting prayers. As the Spirit enabled me to concentrate on deeper prayer, I found I was spending most of the time in confessing and repenting of my sins. I was led by the Spirit to delve into the roots of my own behaviors. Finally, I felt my soul was advancing to the time of listening to God. My mind, spirit and soul were geared up for it after such confessing prayers. When I was honest with my soul owning up the splitting self, I felt free with a sense of unity with God who offered deep comforting GRACE.

Confession is good for our soul. Confessional prayers lead us to see ourselves split up by sins and invite God in to cleanse and restore us! Willard says, "Confession is very important to discover our soul.

Confession is one of the most revolutionary disciplines. Confession is the first sign of revival as it breaks the hindrances to soul restoration."

This profound **Lenten** Season, watch out for your soul! Own up to your split selves through confessional prayers. When your soul is lost, your life is not centered until you invite God in. So practice the discipline of confession and own up to its power until you get in touch with your soul! And God will be found!

Financial Update

Our Stewardship Scorecard Operating Budget Fiscal Year July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024

Giving Income Budgeted through January: \$376,035

Giving Income Received through January: \$381,483 (THANK YOU!

Budgeted Income through January: \$616,211

All Income through January: \$546,879

Budgeted Expenses through January: \$616,462

All expenses through January: \$560,057

Operating Deficit through January: \$(13,178)

Since the last time finances were reported in November, we have been able to reduce our deficit in the operating fund by almost 50%. This is great news. Coupled with an increase in pledges for calendar year 2024, we are turning in the right direction. What Aldersgate does matters, and this is being reflected in our giving as it is in countless other ways.

But... There always seems to be a but! We have challenges. Our costs are experiencing inflation faster than we expected. Many ministries report they will need some additional funds before we close out the fiscal year in June. And, we have a loan from the Endowment Fund that comes due in April of this year and totals \$265,000. The loan was taken out from funds given to Aldersgate from bequests that specified we could use income from the investments but not the principal itself. We did it to improve building comfort with heating and air conditioning updates at a time when a capital campaign was not felt to be appropriate.

In responding to the challenges, here is what we are doing:

- Members of the Lead Team are examining their pledges and prayerfully considering increases for 2024 commitments.
- All committees and ministries are examining their budgets and adjusting what is needed for the remainder of the fiscal year, considering what we must have to continue the ministry.
- The loan will continue to go unpaid until July, when we will begin paying interest and then program principal repayments as soon as possible.

So, what can we all do together? A little from all of us means more than a windfall from one of us. Can we?

- Add \$3 to each ACH payment to cover the transaction fees?
- Turn off the lights when we leave a room?
- Encourage a community group to use Aldersgate for a meeting to generate a little building use income?
- Forego a reimbursement when we buy items for church use?





Lead Team Meeting Minutes January 23, 2024

Current Financial Position

The current projected financial position for Aldersgate as of June 30, 2024 is a net loss of \$33,306, including a budgeted transfer of \$67,228 from the Memorials fund which have not yet been allocated. Based on discussion the following steps were unanimously approved:

- Lead Team members will prayerfully review their individual 2024 pledges and revise them if called to do so.
- All ministries and committees will submit revised expense forecasts through June 30 to the Finance Committee by February 9.
- Finance will process the changes to pledges and expense forecasts and present a revised budget for consideration at the February Lead Team meeting.

HVAC Loan

Background: In 2019, \$265K was loaned from the Endowment Fund to the Capital Fund for a period of 5 years under terms of 4% simple annual interest (\$883/mo) to be paid through February 2024 with the loan extendable at that time. The interest payments were made through June 2022 out of the Trustees budget at which time it was agreed to suspend them.

- The Lead Team approved:
- Extending the loan for up to an additional 5 years.
- Continuing with the suspension of interest payments through the current FY 2023-2024.
- Reinstating interest payments at the 4% rate in the Trustees FY 2024-2025 budget.
