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respect those who couldn't win medals. My heart went to those who are not Simone Biles. It's a situation in which we all find ourselves from time to time.



ALPHA TO OMEGA (237)

Genesis and Revelation: Stories of Creation and Re-Creation

In many respects, the books that begin and end our scriptures seem very different. Yet, they share an unexpectedly similar purpose, as each book can be read as written to a community of faith that was living through trials and hardships, seeking to understand God's direction for its future. As such, these books share stories whose themes include creation as well as re-creation. In this year's study, we will take a fresh look at these two books, seeking to understand their application to the challenges and hardships faced by the faith communities of our time.

GENERATION GO (Room 236)

As the name implies, Generation Go caters largely to parents "on the go," however all are welcome to attend class. Our class is offered hybrid style so you can attend in-person or via zoom. We typically choose online studies with a 10 - 20-minute video message followed by class discussion of the topic presented. Studies do not require any advanced prep (although supplemental reading is available), so drop in, visitors are always welcome!

THE EXPLORERS (Chapel)

The Explorer Class is so-named because we explore the classics of Christian thought, theology, literature and spirituality. Led by Bert Diemer, the class has short reading assignments each week that are the basis for Sunday discussion. Our original focus was to examine those who influenced John Wesley and his thought, but we are open to the suggestions of our class members regarding study material, and several of this year's topics have branched away from Wesley's influencers. LOVE DOES (Room 122)

We are a group of young adults that meet weekly for faith studies and fellowship. Our focus is to strengthen our faith foundation and relationships as we navigate life with growing families. Members of this group take turns facilitating lessons, planning social events, and providing outreach opportunities. This group organizes one of Aldersgate's largest outreach ministries, Christmas Joy! Christmas Joy is an Aldersgate ministry where church members donate holiday gifts and needed items to those in need in the Wilmington area through various organizations.



Share the Journey



"God calls us to make our churches safe places, protecting children and other vulnerable persons from abuse. God calls us to create communities of faith where children and adults grow safe and strong." Safe Sanctuaries is the movement and initiative to fulfill this call upon us – to make our churches safe places for the young and the vulnerable and those in ministry with them.

Because we believe that Jesus taught us to care for His children, youth, and vulnerable persons, we commit Aldersgate to the practice of safe supervision.

As persons of faith, and as United Methodists in particular, our Social Principals state: 'Once considered the property of their parents, children are now acknowledged to be full human beings in their own right, but beings to whom adults and society in general have special obligations. . . ."

One of those obligations is a commitment to keeping them safe.

Our congregation's purpose for establishing this Safe Sanctuary Policy is to demonstrate our absolute and unwavering commitment to the physical safety and spiritual growth of all vulnerable persons in our church's care.

Therefore, as a Christian community of faith and a United Methodist congregation, we pledge to conduct the ministry of the gospel in ways that assure the safety and spiritual growth of all our vulnerable persons, as well as those who work with them.

The purpose of safe sanctuary is to provide a safe environment for all persons as much as possible so that no one is harmed, yet also recognizing the need for all persons to have the opportunity to worship. The church continues its policy of performing screening and training procedures for workers involved in the care of children, youth and vulnerable adults.

The Lead Team has recently approved a change to our Safe Sanctuaries screening and training provider. We will now be using Safe Gatherings, which is endorsed by both Pen Del and Baltimore Washington Conferences. This is the gold standard in background checks.

You will need to be background checked if you have any involvement with children, youth or vulnerable adults. Think Youth Musical, Confirmation mentors, Sunday School, Impact, Music Ministry, visitation. You will need to be background checked with our new provider even if your most recent background check is still valid.

Safe Gatherings tracks everything online. Training is provided online at your own pace and timing. It does not need to be completed in one sitting. Background checks are valid for three years. We are going paperless and entering the 21st century!

There is no cost to you for a background check. Each background check is \$39, a considerable expense for the church, but this is not where we want to economize. With that said, should you feel led to pay for your own background check, we will not say no!

I am happy to say the staff were the guinea pigs for the new system, and we were impressed with the ease of the process, as well as the ability to access the training when it worked best for each of us.


Communications Report

Why Do You Give?

See if you recognize yourself in some of the motivators discussed in this two-part series. It turns out that we don't all give for the same reason, and it's important to understand that. Perhaps you give to more than one organization, each with a different mission. As you read this, you may gain a deeper insight into your own philanthropy, with a deepening satisfaction as you gain greater self-awareness. Some or all of these dimensions may apply to your support of your church.

In this edition, we'll discuss four types with three more next month. These are taken from a column by C. David Buchanan titled *CounterPoints in Stewardship: Why People Give (To Your Church)*. He built his comments on a list provided by Indiana University School of Philanthropy (1999).

- <u>Altruists</u> give out of generosity and empathy. They believe that their church cares about the poor and powerless, the lonely and the lost. They have a generous spirit toward organizations that will do something good for individuals and/or society. Their church is a cause worth supporting.
- <u>Communitarians</u> give because every community needs to have certain things: a fire department, a rescue squad, schools, hospitals, and... churches.

Devout individuals give for religious reasons and feel that giving is a moral obligation. They simply want

to have an experience with God. It is an offering to God, a holy act, based solely on faith.

Dynasts give because it is expected. Giving is deeply embedded in their family tradition and often plays an important role in family relationships. "Our family came to this church when it was founded, and has been a presence ever since. It is our responsibility to keep this tradition alive."


