#### **Missionary Mindset**

Recently, I was totally surprised and delighted by a child who knelt on the floor to bow down, saying "Many blessings this New Year" in Korean, right after our contemporary service. His father is a Korean American who knows the Korean tradition. On New Year's Day, Korean children bow down before their parents and grandparents,

wishing Happy New Year and they give cash gifts to the children, wishing the same blessing. I used to do it, wearing a special colorful costume for the New Year's celebration. Most of the kids get lots of monetary gifts from their parents, grandparents, and other relatives, and they save them to use for what they need. It's a beautiful tradition that is still being practiced. However, now living in America, I was forgetting it until I was struck by the joy that the child offered. Let me tell you, it was a perfect moment when my dormant homesickness was relieved. I was led to think of where I am and who I am with two cultures immersed in my life: Korean and American into which I am being enculturated as an immigrant family.



I am officially considered "a pastor in a cross-racial, cross-cultural ministry setting". I have joined some training workshops offered by our denomination and conference to gain deeper understanding for dealing with different cultures and races. One of the blessings from this ministry setting, among many, is that I grow every moment when I discern differences and similarities to CONNECT with people. My intentional efforts to find this INTERCONNECTEDNESS in Jesus Christ are a major part of my ministry. I consider myself 'a missionary pastor' just as missionaries to foreign countries often try to interconnect people of different cultures with Jesus Christ. One of my hero missionaries is E. Stanley Jones (1884-1973) from Baltimore. He was an American Methodist Christian missionary to India sent by the Board of Missions of the Methodist Episcopal Church. He is well known for his interreligious lectures to the educated classes in India. He was a close friend of Mahatma Gandhi. To integrate Jesus into the Indian culture, they communicated with an interconnected mindset, feeling free to persuade and learn from each other gently. He taught Christians to approach the mission field as if we were from a different country, learning a new culture and a new way of communicating.

This New Year, I invite you to have a missionary mindset in which we neither lament nor fear changes in life, but dare to expect changes. The apostle Paul says, "Our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ." (Philippians 2:20) Without this perspective, I would have to give up my 'missionary pastor' vocation due to hardships. You and I are sojourners here on earth. We have been sent here as the missionaries of Jesus Christ. We are invited to LEARN new things, not with fear but with boldness. Let's not give up our missionary vocation, while learning constantly. Discern how you empower yourself in your life's places with this missionary mindset.

When we took our vows of church membership, we promised to faithfully participate in the ministries of the church through our prayers. Therefore, we are *all* called to be part of this prayer team at Aldersgate. Here are some intentional ways that we can care for one another through prayer:

- \* Set your alarm to 3:33PM or, at a daily time of your choosing, to pray for our church.
- \* Every Tuesday, the Aldersgate prayer list is updated and emailed. It is also printed in the weekly worship bulletin. To add or change a prayer need on this list, please email <a href="mailto:prayerlist@aldersgatede.org">prayerlist@aldersgatede.org</a> or call the church office and leave a message at 302-478-2575. Prayers will remain on the list for 4 weeks unless otherwise requested.
- \* Visit our Prayer Wall on our website: https://aldersgatede. Click on "Send us a Message" on the <u>Need a Prayer?</u> banner. Here you can post prayer needs- publicly or anonymously. You can also click the praying hands icon to let others know that you have prayed for them too.
- \* Complete a prayer card in the sanctuary or chapel drop it in the prayer boxes outside the Sanctuary or leave them in the HUB in the Congregational Care #4 mailbox.
- \* Volunteer to lead our weekly Congregational Prayer at the 9:00 or 11:00 service. You'll receive the 3 weekly prayer points before the weekend and create a prayer to share in worship that lifts up these prayer points.



Often, we make a mess of our lives and wonder if there is any redemption. In this book, pastor and author Tom Berlin helps us see our mess through the eyes of Christ to find redemption and restoration. Using Scripture, devotional tools, and the writings of Ignatius of Loyola, John of the Cross, St. Augustine, John Wesley, Evelyn Underhill, and others, Berlin encourages reflection and meditation through our own brokenness. Only then can we focus on the cross as the place where we truly surrender control, leave our mess, and find redemption.

#### **HOPP Food Distribution**

Friday, February 28, 2025

Volunteers are needed to distribute free food boxes/bags provided by the Longwood Foundation's HOPP Ministry to anyone in need in our community. We gather in the Aldersgate parking lot at 12:15 p.m. to set up and get organized, and then distribute boxes from 12:30 p.m. until 1:30 p.m. Volunteers are needed to hold up signs at the curb on Concord Pike, direct the flow of cars to our distribution point as they come in, and place boxes/bags into cars. This is a

rewarding, hands-on ministry that directly serves our local community and also provides opportunity for fellowship.



Aldersgate's administrative assistant, Kyle, not only maintains the Hub at church, she is actually the "Hub" of many tasks and activities to keep the church going. By definition, hub means the "effective center of an activity or network" which perfectly describes her role.



Her tasks include phone, postal mail, email, social media; she produces weekly worship bulletins, funeral bulletins, event flyers, the

Liturgical calendar; she distributes the weekly prayer list and the monthly newsletter; she coordinates meetings for staff, weddings, baptism classes and she oversees the DOVs (Daily Office Volunteers), the Leadership Officiary and office supplies. You name it, Kyle does it.

Kyle shared the most enjoyable part of her job is working with the staff and members of the church. Also, as a member of Aldersgate for 13 years, Kyle has been a member of the Hannah Circle, including the leader, and participates in numerous activities. She also serves on the Committee on Nominations and Leadership Development, as well as the Communications Committee.

Chelsea Spyres, who was chosen as a Woman of Influence and launched the WKC across all the

church kitchens (4) it uses.



There are new rules to follow since the kitchen is now used commercially. Look for the signs that will instruct how to set up washing, rinsing and sanitizing of any pots, pans, etc. that are used. When you are all done, there is a checklist to follow and complete. The checklist is posted on the bulletin board as you enter the kitchen area.





#### **UWF Impact**


