Before beginning my sabbatical, I suggested to our Music Director, Anastasiia, that we choose "In Jesus Name (God of Possible)" by Katy Nichole as the Lenten theme song for our contemporary service. This powerful song proclaims healing, faith, and the miraculous possibilities found in Christ. Throughout my sabbatical, I prayed with it almost daily. Its message became a source of deep strength and comfort, often moving me to tears, drawing me into moments of stillness, and leading me into a greater reliance on the Spirit of God.

I invite you to recite the lyrics with me now:

I speak the name of Jesus over you (Names you choose)
In your hurting, in your sorrow
I will ask my God to move
I speak the name 'cause it's all that I can do
In desperation, I'll seek heaven
And pray this for you
I pray for your healing
That circumstances would change
I pray that the fear inside would flee
In Jesus name
I pray that a breakthrough would happen today
I pray miracles over your life in Jesus name
In Jesus name
I speak the name of all authority

Declaring blessings and every promise
He is faithful to keep
I speak the name no grave could ever hold
He is greater, He is stronger
He's the God of possible
Come believe it
Come receive it
Oh, the power of His Spirit is now forever yours
In the mighty name of Jesus, all things are possible
I pray for revival
For restoration of faith
I pray that the dead will come alive
In Jesus name

To me, this song is more than a melody—it is a bold declaration of the Risen Lord, the God of Possible. It's the perfect Easter praise song. Katy Nichole wrote it out of her own suffering and healing, particularly her experience with scoliosis and major surgery. Her testimony speaks of God's power to perform miracles, even in our darkest valleys.

I encourage you to read these lyrics three times. Then close your eyes and pray—for yourself, for those you love, and for your neighbors in need of healing. Let this be a sacred moment of remembering when the God of Possible walked with you through the shadowed valley. Recall the ways He met you in the wilderness and gently called you toward Himself.

Have you felt the prayers of Jesus, full of compassion, lifting you when you couldn't lift yourself? Has God shown you how suffering can become a profound teacher—one that fosters empathy and binds us together around the table of life?

I pray for your restoration, just as Jesus does.

Prayer sets the stage for healing. It leads us home—to the dwelling place of God's abiding goodness and compassion. God invites us to release our fears, to anoint our worries with trust, and to rest in His presence, where His still, assuring voice speaks peace.

Do you feel the need for healing and renewal today?

I speak the name of Jesus over you.

Come. Believe in Jesus, our Grace-filled Healer.

Receive Him.

May God lead you to deep peace and guide you toward restoration of body and soul.

Let us keep the faith until we are led **HOME**.


Adult - Practicing Hope,




Trap Opera, the Verbier Festival in Switzerland, the Ravinia Festival in Chicago as well as others.



We have good news regarding our financial standing at the close of 2024. The final figures show that, when we combine all our operational financial activities, the church ended the year with a modest surplus of \$6,051.46.

Several factors contributed to this positive outcome. Importantly, our updated financial system now provides a clearer picture of how your generous donations are used within a particular year. Previously, we did not include ongoing donations for specific ministries within our operating results or budget. This meant we continued to transfer funds among accounts and did not have cur-



rent financial information in many areas. Now, funds given for ministries such as the Music Ministry, the Youth Musical, Arts at Aldersgate, or the Choir, are directly included in the **Gather** budget (the budget for our worship and fellowship activities). We can readily see the resources available for these valuable programs.

Similarly, the **Grow** budget reflects the income designated for this year's Mission Trip and other specific educational programs, ensuring those funds are accounted for as they will be used. Our **Go** budget continues to track the donations specifically intended for the outreach missions we support annually.

Furthermore, we were able to draw less from our Gift and Endowment funds this past year than in previous years. We are grateful that regular giving from our members has remained consistent with past years, which helped our operating income.

This new way of accounting provides a comprehensive view of the funds Aldersgate receives and uses each year, all in one place. It also simplifies the tracking of mission funds that come from various sources. Many in the church have expressed the desire for your targeted donations to directly support additional ministry activities, and this new system allows us to do so more effectively and with greater clarity. At the same time, it remains vital that we can cover our essential operating costs—keeping the lights on and the AC flowing—without increasing our reliance on the Endowment or Memorial & Gift funds.


Looking ahead this year, we have a familiar need as the summer months approach. When many of us travel, our regular giving often decreases. As you prepare for summer trips, we kindly ask that you consider sending in your contributions to the church in advance, perhaps with a little extra, or add to your ACH withdrawal. Your continued generosity will enable our ministries to maintain their momentum even when fewer of us are in the pews. Thank you for your ongoing support and dedication to Aldersgate.



What a wonderful time of fellowship and service we had during the 2025 Rummage Sale! We extend our sincere THANK YOU to all of you who participated. 150 volunteers signed in to help prepare, sort, price, sell and pack out our wares. And many more people donated items, brought in delicious baked goods, and came to shop. It is always an amazing mixture of hard work and camaraderie. If you did not participate this year, please plan ahead to help out next year – all are welcomed with open arms.

Our gross receipts were \$24,672 this year, slightly higher than last year! After expenses are finalized, we will be donating a 10% tithe to HOPP (Harvest Outreach People Project). This program hands out food bags every 4th Friday of the month at churches in the area (including ours). HOPP is another amazing chance to be a part of Aldersgate's hands-on ministry. As always, our youth who worked four hours or more will each get \$100 of support for the mission trip.

We had a steady stream of customers throughout our sale day and we heard many compliments from them about what a well-run sale we have. In addition to our sale proceeds, we have expanded our post-sale outreach.

- * Small furniture and some housewares were donated to Westminster Presbyterian Church's New Life Furnishings program, which helps formerly homeless or incarcerated people get furnishings for their newly-acquired housing.
- * Dishware, an aero-bed and some active play toys were donated to Family Promise.
- * Nice handbags were donated to the YWCA for a program they have periodically to provide good quality pocketbooks to their clients.
- * Accessories, jewelry and home décor items were donated to Delaware Breast Cancer Coalition for its Great Stuff Savvy Resale Shop in Talleyville.
- * Several bicycles were donated to the Urban Bike Project.
- Leftover children's books were held for use at Aldersgate.
- * And the remaining items were taken by Goodwill to support their various thrift stores.

If you know of other programs that can use our leftovers in future years, please let one of us know.

Just as valuable as the recycling of all these items is the new and renewed connection we make with each other throughout the event process. We hope you enjoy a few of the many photographs taken to document this program. Thanks again and we hope to have you involved (again) next year.
