As Paul wrote, "I thank my God every time I remember you... being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus" (Philippians 1:3, 6).

May the God who goes before you lead you always with grace. May Christ dwell richly in your hearts, and may the Spirit empower you to be light and hope in this world. Amen.

Pen-Del Annual Conference, May 2025 - Cheryl Merritt, Reserve Lay Member



In May, I attended the Peninsula-Delaware Annual Conference in Ocean City, MD as Aldersgate's Reserve Lay Member. The theme of this year's conference was Rejoice in the Lord – Dwell in Joy!

Worship is interwoven among holy conferencing and

ministry updates over the 3-day conference. Pen-Del is known for our worship! The energy in the room is electric with everyone praising together. We witnessed powerful Bible study teachings and sermons from Bishop Latrelle Easterling and Bishop Sandra Steiner Ball reflecting on Paul's letter to the Phillippians 4:4-9 where Paul references Isaiah and the wilderness. We were reminded that when we find ourselves in the wilderness, the unknown, and the messiness of life, this is where we learn to trust God to do a new thing! We were encouraged to rejoice and dwell in joy!

We heard many conference ministry updates during the general and laity sessions. Camp Pecometh, UWF, UMM, UMCOR, VIM and Missional Action Planning just to name a few! Young people's ministry was highlighted with the announcement of the new ministry director, Natiya Bennett. They encouraged folks to attend the upcoming Intergenerational Worship Forum June 2026 and Ignite Youth Rally March 20-22, 2026. Methodist connectionalism was celebrated as we have a built-in network of congregations making it easy to multiply the impact of our ministries when we work together!

During the business part of conference, we engaged in holy conferencing and voted on UMC constitutional amendments and local resolutions. We voted on 4 amendments: Regionalization (moving from a US centric church structure to a global structure), revising inclusive gender and ability language for membership, strengthening anti-racism work, and clarifying criteria for elected clergy to General Conference. A 2/3 aggregate world vote is needed to pass these therefore, the voting results are expected in November.

We adopted local resolutions: Apportionment plan of \$3,965,755 to support ministry needs, improved clergy pension and health benefits, kinship care policy for clergy, and closing of Union UMC in Salisbury, MD and Red Lion UMC, in Red Lion Delaware.

It was my honor to represent Aldersgate this year. If you ever have the opportunity to attend annual conference I highly recommend it. I shared my experiences in our worship service on July 13th. If you have questions about any of the material, presentations, or voting items please ask anytime! I also invite you to watch the livestream next year and watch

this year's recordings on the Pen-Del website <u>pen-del.org/2025-annual-conference</u>. It will lift your spirits and renew your faith in unexpected ways! "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice!" (Phillippians 4:4)

LEAD TEAM REPORT

At our June meeting, the Catalyst Team proposed to the Lead Team to work together to move Aldersgate ever forward towards being a more vital church. The goal is to share learnings from the Catalyst experience with the Lead Team members in order to apply the lens of church vitality into decision making and encourage the Lead Team to move beyond church maintenance work and lean into visioning for the church's future.

Next steps include a commitment for Catalyst Team at each Lead Team meeting to introduce vitality concepts and action steps to test over the coming month. In between monthly Lead Team meetings, Catalyst Team members will be in conversation with the Lead Team members to offer 1:1 coaching on vitality concepts specific to the teams that they lead. The effectiveness of this relationship model will be re-evaluated in 6-12 months.

The proposal was accepted by the Lead Team, and 1 to 1 coaching is underway in preparation for our next Lead Team meeting.

Welcome to Aldersgate's Interim Pastor Rev. Jennifer Kerby

Bishop LaTrelle Easterling has appointed Rev. Jennifer Kerby as the Interim Pastor of our Congregation. Pastor Kerby will begin her new responsibilities on October 1. Pastor Kerby has some commitments in September that do not allow her to start full time until October 1. She will begin to meet with staff and leadership beginning in mid-August.

A native Delawarean having grown up in Newark, Rev. Jennifer is a lifelong follower of Jesus, through a wide variety of life stages, work and community service experiences, and cultural/ethnic communities. During her adventuresome twenties, she migrated beyond the state borders, living in Boston, MA (attending theology school the first time) and Gilroy, CA (the Garlic Capital of the World so they claim). After that, a growing family, along with supporting her husband's business, working part-time and volunteering at church and nonprofits kept her occupied through her thirties and early forties.

After hearing the call to ministry (the second time) and with four children, ages 15-3 at home, she entered Lancaster Seminary in September 2001 (yes just days before 9/11), was commissioned as a Probationary Elder in 2005 and ordained as a Full Elder of the Peninsula-Delaware Annual Conference in 2008. She loves joyful and vibrant worship in many expressions inclusive of traditional, contemporary, reflective/meditational, participatory and conversational; when worship is Spirit led, it becomes life affirming, life-giving and life transforming. She is also gifted and experienced in the areas of administrative ministry and Christ-based social justice advocacy. She returns to full-time ministry after retiring in 2020 from Mount Lebanon UMC.

She and her husband, Brent Apotheker, celebrated 38 years of life together this year and are enjoying being home alone now that their four children have all found their way in their lives, careers and pursuits beyond their childhood home on Foulk Road.

They are looking forward to this next chapter of their lives with Aldersgate and pray God's blessing on all that we will do and experience together in Jesus' name.

After August 3 and until October 1, Chaplain Rev. Metty Mesick will fill in as needed to preach, lead worship, and cover pastoral emergencies.
