Welcome to the Season of Light

Epiphany, the time of fresh revelations and insights, is upon us!

Epiphany is one of the oldest Christian feasts, with its origins dating back to the 2nd or 3rd century. The word "epiphany" comes from the Greek word *epiphaneia*, meaning "manifestation" or "revelation." Originally, the feast celebrated several key moments in the life of Jesus when his divinity was revealed to the world: the visit of the Magi, his baptism in the Jordan River, his first miracle at the wedding in Cana. The liturgical season of Epiphany is completed with the occasion of Christ's transfiguration on the mountain top prior to his return to Jerusalem to face his passion and death.

Over time, the Western Christian church began to focus the January 6th celebration specifically on the journey of the Three Magi, traditionally known as Melchior, Caspar, and Balthazar, who followed a star to Bethlehem to honor the newborn King of the Jews. Their journey and worship of the Babe of Bethlehem represent the revelation of Jesus to the non-Jewish world, symbolizing that his message was for all of humanity.

United Methodists typically observe Epiphany on the Sunday nearest to January 6. With themes of light in the midst of conflict and confusion, we continue to seek and share how Jesus still reveals God's love, justice and grace in our lives and world today. Likewise, we are called to listen deeply for how God is calling us to new insights and opportunities.

As Aldersgate UMC prepares to receive a new pastor this summer, I would urge each of you to prayerfully pause during this season of revelation. Take time to humble yourself and offer anew your heart, mind, strength and spirit to Christ. Let go of what you think may be best based on your past experience, and consider the new revelations of how God is calling this congregation to be transformed to be a brighter light for the wider community.



Her ministry reflects a heart for transformation that meets spiritual needs while addressing the practical realities people face every day.

Pastor Tami currently serves as the Executive Director of The Harvest Outreach People's Project (The HOPP), a faith-based nonprofit dedicated to combating food insecurity and building healthier, more resilient communities. Under her leadership, The HOPP operates impactful programs such as Pack & Pray, HOPP Drops, and HOPP Dash, and is preparing to launch a new central resource center and distribution hub. The organization is also expanding its reach beyond Delaware into Maryland and Washington, D.C., partnering with churches, volunteers, and local leaders to serve families and strengthen communities. Throughout her leadership journey, Pastor Tami has stewarded over \$50 million in grant funding to support housing, food access, youth development, and outreach initiatives, putting her faith into action on a transformative scale.



Stewardship Update

The Stewardship Committee is happy to report that as of early December, we've matched the same number of pledges as last year at this time, while having an increase in the overall pledge total. We're so excited to see how the campaign ends up, and thankful to those who have responded by Committing to Us in such a positive way!

Those pledges are so important for the other aspects of Stewardship – the commitment of your gifts, service, prayers, presence, and witness. Without the core contributions to Aldersgate, we cannot serve our community or help bring others along in our commitment to Christ.

Just some of the activities that have had a direct impact in 2025:

- Through Family Promise, we will have served warm dinners to approximately 73 families (about 255 people).
- Through HOPP, we will have handed out over 1200 bags of food to those in need in our local community (right in our parking lot).
- Through Emmanuel Dining Room, we will have served approximately 1,760 meals, almost 12 meals per volunteer man-hour.

As we look ahead to 2026, there are numerous opportunities to continue to Commit to Us as the Aldersgate community. Working together, we can do more for those in need and strengthen our connection to each other and to Jesus. The Stewardship committee will be rolling out additional programming throughout the year connecting each aspect of stewardship with opportunities here at Aldersgate, so please keep an eye out.

Over the past 18 months, the Catalyst Core Team has been learning about the Catalyst initiative and its potential to strengthen Aldersgate's vitality by improving its connection to the community. Here, team members share how this journey has shaped their faith lives.

<u>Lynne Conlan</u> - Going through the Catalyst program I was reminded that my fundamental purpose on this earth is to serve other people. If I don't know them, then I should get to know them. It also reminded me to practice Empathy not Apathy. Get involved! "Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying,' Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I send me!" (Isa 6:8)

<u>Cheryl Merritt</u> - As Christians, we're given two instructions; Love God and Love one another. Working with Catalyst challenges me to follow those instructions in a fresh way. The trainings inspire me to be curious about the people in our community, use new tools to form deeper relationships, and engage in a process to help discern who God is (or is not) calling us into in ministry together. My faith has been tested and strengthened the more I experience first hand that I have to reduce my need for control and patiently rely on God's timing to use me or, set me aside, to get God's work done here in North Wilmington and beyond.

<u>Dan Shay</u> - As an engineer, connecting with people does not come naturally, but design thinking does! Catalyst has shown me how to think about discipleship in the context of the example that Jesus set for all of us: go out into community and truly understand and empathize with those around us. This 'data gathering' allows us to better serve and continually improve in meeting the needs of our community.

Henry Daum - As with many older people, my world has gotten smaller. I no longer go to work, and I don't travel as much. Even so, my involvement with Catalyst has shown me that helping Aldersgate thrive and become more connected to our community requires me to stay open to God's guidance—to stay curious about what's happening not only inside Aldersgate but around us as well, and to look for new opportunities for partnerships with our neighbors. I'm already seeing it happen!


